



The clown fish:

Clownfishes are small fishes that they live in Indo-Pacific and Red sea. The female is larger than the male.

Clownfishes are yellow or orange and show white bars or patches.

They live in symbiosis with sea anemones. The anemone's poison protects the fish from predators and cleans it from parasites.

Thanks to a substance produced by the fish skin, clownfishes are not identified as a food by its anemone. In return, once adopted by an anemone, the clownfish vigorously defends it against fishes that attack the tentacles, like the butterfly fish.
